Auckland

Auckland is the country's largest and most populated region. Surrounded by the crystal clear waters, the city is like a big playground, offering something special whether you're after relaxation, excitement, or both! It's also where you can find the Au Pair Link office.

Waikato

Taranaki

After a major earthquake in 2011, Christchurch is on an exciting journey to become one of the world's most innovative and modern cities.



To one family, you're a superstar.

As an au pair with Au Pair Link, your childcare skills and knowledge will bloom working on our early learning programme, based on the New Zealand Early Childhood Education curriculum. Caring for at least one child under five years old, we provide you with everything to make sure your little ones are literally having the time of their life!

Our team of Programme Managers are all qualified early childhood teachers, and are dedicated to supporting you while you're here. That includes a monthly visit to your host family's home, as well as weekly activities with other au pairs and their children, educational resources, and more!

The name of New Zealand's early childhood curriculum is Te Whāriki. Translated as 'the woven mat' from Māori (New Zealand's indigenous language, known as Te Reo Māori), it covers the education of all New Zealand children from birth to school age. Together, we'll weave a series of learning experiences into your children's daily routine, helping them:

- Be curious
- Develop their natural interests
- Persist with difficulty and problem-solving
- Express their ideas through creativity, and
- Take responsibility.

You'll relish in seeing the children develop into happy, healthy and confident young learners. By creating daily learning experiences which focus on your child's individual personality and interests, Te Whāriki provides you with a foundation on which to build some amazing learning experiences while you are here.

Together, we'll work together to weave a learning story for the children you care for (who are under five years of age). Over the next two pages, you'll see how we pull the strands of Te Whāriki together, creating experiences which enrich children's understanding of the world around them, and their place in it.

The learning journey

Supported by Au Pair Link's qualified early childhood teachers, you'll help children under five discover their place in the world through experiences which create the child's learning journey.

We create opportunities for au pairs to explore learning opportunities with their children, enriched through the lens of your own culture.



Playgroups

We run weekly playgroups in all of our regions, and in some cases multiple groups each week (we currently have five weekly playgroups in Auckland!). Playgroups give you the opportunity to bring children to different sessions and meet new friends. They also provide an informal time for you to catch up with your Programme Manager and seek any extra support that may be required from us. We often have themed playgroups, and love seeing all the children running around in their costumes, singing songs and sharing story time together.

Regular home visits

We employ Programme Managers who are all qualified early childhood teachers to work with you, catching up with you at home each month and ensuring you and the children are feeling happy and comfortable in your placement. These meetings are important, as it gives us precious time to ensure you're all up to date with learning stories and your Communication Book entries. This one-on-one time gives you a chance to raise any issues with your Programme Manager. We're always there to make sure you're having a great placement!



Au pair & child events

We like you and the children to explore your local community through our regular events. At least once a month we send out an invite to a local event such as going to the zoo, a farm, the fire station or a beach - where children can discover the world around them together. With our close-knit network of au pairs and educators in tow, it's not unusual to hear children naming their favourite animals in German or asking their local baker about pain au chocolat!

Learning timeline

As educators, you will have access to an interactive 'learning timeline' for each child under five in your care. The timeline is a place you can post photos, learning stories, journal entries and other memorable moments to share with your host parents. Host families and Programme Managers can also post comments and feedback to support the au pair during their placement. This is a great way to share your experience with family and friends, securely!

Professional Learning

We offer you our on-going childcare training and support, right from the moment you arrive at our orientation course. In addition, we organise regular professional learning sessions for you and your host parents, conducted by our Programme Managers or guest speakers. These are a fantastic opportunity to learn more about childcare, nutrition, positive behaviour techniques, and so much more!

Communication Books & Child Portfolios

We provide each child under five with an individual *Child Portfolio* which records their progress and development through a series of learning stories, written by you, their loving au pair! These often become a treasured item for you and the children, as a memento of your time together. Similarly, our *Communication Book* helps you to establish a dialogue with your host family about the children's needs, to ensure their day-to-day care requirements are being met.

Educational resources

We have a great range of free educational resources (books, music, toys) and resource kits for our au pair to explore with the children. Whether your child is interested in art, music, dinosaurs or creepy-crawlies, our kits are designed to fill your child's mind with curiosity about the world around them. We even provide online learning tools and literacy and numeracy kits for children who are transitioning to school.



Au Pair 123

Our most popular programme, for au pairs working with at least one child under five.

Au Pair 123 is our core au pair programme, licensed by New Zealand's Ministry of Education and the first programme of its kind in the world! The programme offers you the opportunity to learn about professional childcare techniques, helping children to discover and explore their own unique skills and interests. We link you with a Programme Manager who supports you throughout the placement term. On the Au Pair 123 programme, you'll attend our weekly playgroups, activities and events, get monthly visits from your Programme Manager, as well as access to our range of educational resource kits - always good for a rainy day! We also organise regular professional learning workshops for you to attend, aiding the growth of your own understanding of children and childcare.

Providing an opportunity to truly master your skills in a sole charge early childhood position, the Au Pair Whiz programme pays a higher weekly wage, in recognition of the specialist knowledge that comes with study and experience. As well as one-on-one support (including a monthly visit) from your Programme Manager, you're invited to join weekly playgroups, outings and events, childcare workshops and learning resources. Au Pair Whiz is the only au pair programme in New Zealand that rewards and recognises candidates' childcare qualifications or experience, providing a springboard to an exciting career in early learning!

Au Pair Assist

Our short-term placement option for candidates already in New Zealand.

On the Au Pair Assist programme we can link you with a host family looking for an au pair to join them immediately. You'll work with at least one child under five and receive all the benefits of our long-term educational programmes. That means you'll have support from a fully qualified early childhood education teacher and have access to our weekly playgroups, outings and childcare training workshops. Our Au Pair Assist programme is a great way to find short-term work if you're already in New Zealand, but if you're looking for something a bit more permanent our Au Pair 123 programme could be right for you. Au Pair Assist is ideal for enthusiastic working travellers who want a rewarding short-term job before continuing on their travels.

Au Pair Mate

Our option for families who have children already at school but need an extra pair of hands to help out from a "big sister or brother."

Au Pair Mate is a programme for families who really need someone who can help out mainly in the mornings and afternoons as all of the children are over 5. They need someone who can help out with the school drop offs and pick ups, someone who can be there to help with homework or activities in the evening and be more of a big brother or sister than a care provider. This is the perfect opportunity for you to build a relationship with your Kiwi family, creating special memories that will last a lifetime. Because the children are at school during the day it also means that you have time to discover more of New Zealand and what it has to offer.

Programme requirements

To be an au pair in New Zealand, we'll need to make sure you meet our programme requirements (for example, you'll need a degree or diploma in ECE to qualify for our Au Pair Whiz programme). In order to qualify for any of our au pair jobs, you'll need to:

- Be aged between 18-30 years
- Have a valid driver's licence
- Speak English to a good standard
- Meet New Zealand visa requirements
- Have a clean police and medical record
- Want to spend 3-12 months living with a host family in New Zealand!

About the job

As an au pair, your primary duty is, of course, to care for your host family's child (or children!). Au pairs caring for little ones enrolled in our Au Pair 123 or Au Pair Whiz programmes are required to participate in our home early learning programme, which includes attending our playgroups, activities, and events, as well as recording important developmental milestones in the form of monthly learning stories or daily journal entries.

Other general au pair responsibilities include

- Waking the children and helping them to get dressed
- Washing and organising the child's clothes and bedding
- Preparing the children's meals and helping them make healthy food choices
- · General household cleaning related to the children
- · Understanding each child's routines and ensuring interactions are caring, calm and responsive
- \cdot $\,$ Helping the children to care for their belongings, and encouraging them to tidy after playtime
- Developing the children's interests and understand through learning experiences at home and in the community
- Ensuring the host family's rules and routines are followed
- Being mindful of any potential hazards the children might encounter, and ensuring their close supervision at all times.

Responsibilities as an early childhood educator

- Attending our regular playgroups, activities and events
- Daily entries into the Communications Book or Programme Journal
- · Writing learning stories for each child under five's Portfolio and Timeline
- Seeking support from your Programme Manager or PORSE Programme Tutor
- Attending professional learning sessions run by Au Pair Link or PORSE
- · Positive interactions with the children

How much will you be paid?

The table below breaks down the wage structure for each of our au pair programmes (please note all figures are expressed in New Zealand Dollars). Because Au Pair 123 and Au Pair Whiz participants are required to have greater hours of previous childcare experience, and work on a government-licensed programme, a higher weekly wage is paid than on our Au Pair Assist programme (only available to local candidates).

The completion bonus

Your host family will also pay you a completion bonus, in recognition of a successful placement term. The completion bonus is \$20 NZD net per week and is prorated over the length of the originally agreed placement term. For example, for a twelve month placement, the net completion bonus is \$1,040 NZD (\$20 NZD x 52 weeks). The completion bonus is paid to you at the end of a placement, and is only payable on completion of the original placement term agreed. This is a great way to boost your funds for a bit of travel at the end of your placement!

Our au pair and host family contract


With Au Pair Link, we ensure all of our au pairs are protected by New Zealand employment law. You'll typically enter New Zealand on a working holiday visa; as there is no specific visa for foreign workers as in other countries, for example the United States' J-1 visa.

Anyone working on a working holiday visa enjoys the same rights and benefits as any other employee in New Zealand, and conversely we require our host families to comply with our Employment Relations Act and other employment laws including the Holidays Act, the Minimum Wage Act, and the Health & Safety in Employment Act.

As part of our commitment to ensuring au pairs are treated fairly, we provide a template Individual Employment Agreement that define the terms of the au pair's employment during their placement term. Having a contract in place is extremely beneficial to au pairs and families alike, as it helps to protect their legal rights. Our Employment Agreement outlines the following aspects of the relationship:

- Holiday pay, sick leave and annual leave benefits au pairs can feel safe in the knowledge they will receive paid holidays and have the ability to take annual leave as agreed with their host family.
- Health and safety these requirements ensure au pairs follow the correct health and safety
 processes in the family home, as well as reporting accidents and potential hazards, ensuring a safe
 working environment for the au pair.
- Termination of agreement au pairs and families can feel secure in the knowledge that if an issue or
 dispute, there is a resolution policy and procedure to ensure any disagreement is resolved fairly and
 efficiently.

Orientation

Our three day Orientation means you can meet new friends and relax before joining your whānau..

After a long international flight, many au pairs experience a stretch of jetlag, as well as some initial culture shock. Our orientation course is mandatory for all international arrivals and is designed to help you adjust to a new time zone, as well as receive valuable childcare training and information.

Orientation begins on Wednesday afternoon with a laid back meet and greet session (most au pairs head straight to bed afterwards!), with Thursday covering everything you need to know with regards to our programmes, the support available, and other important information to help your placement start on the right foot.

On Friday we also run a very popular tour of Auckland City. You will see Mount Eden, the Harbour Bridge, Sky Tower and more! The tour also includes lunch at Ristorante Andrea, set against the tranquil backdrop of one of the city's most popular beaches, Mission Bay.

- Child First Aid course run by St Johns and theoretical driving lessons

Most au pairs travel to New Zealand on a working holiday visa. While this application needs to be submitted by the individual applying, we're able to provide the best advice and ensure eligibility for the scheme through our series of step-by-step guides and other pre-departure resources.

Our travel insurance package

It's necessary for au pairs visiting New Zealand to book travel insurance for the duration of their stay. Working alongside Cover-More Travel Insurance, we provide a sense of security in the case of any unforeseen medical expenses, accidents or lost/stolen property during the placement term. Below is a list of benefits included in Cover-More's Essentials insurance policy:

- Medical and dental expenses
- Additional expenses (sickness, injury, natural disasters)
- Amendment/cancellation costs (dependent on responsibility)
- Luggage and travel documents (loss, theft or damage)
- Money (loss or theft)
- Adventure activities abseiling, bungy, parachuting, etc.
- Travel delay (accommodation where flight delays exceed six hours)

- Skiing/snowboarding
- Motorcycle/moped riding
- Rental car excess (extra cost).

Please note, a \$100 NZD excess applies to all claims under the *Your Cover* standard insurance package.

New Zealand's working holiday visa

Applying for a working holiday visa is an important component of the application process, and one that must be completed by the candidate. While we can provide some assistance, it is the applicant's responsibility to pay and secure their visa. Payment of \$165 NZD is made directly to Immigration New Zee

of \$165 NZD is made directly to Immigration New Zealand. The visa is free candidates applying from the United States.



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Our programme fee

Typically au pairs are required to pay a programme fee, which includes round trip flights and our Cover-More *Essentials* insurance package. The fee is based on departure from the international airports listed below. Because air travel prices are prone to fluctuation, we encourage candidates to liaise with our travel bookings team to ensure they receive the best prices for travel to New Zealand.

- South America São Paulo
- Asia Bangkok, Beijing, Shanghai and Hong Kong
- Australia Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane.
